  services to get the best deal.
- Right to be heard: Consumers' needs and interests should be top priorities. They should be listened to by appropriate consumer welfare groups or committees set up by the authorities or the government.
- Right to Seek Redressal: Shoppers should know they can file complaints and seek justice against
  unfair trade practices. This includes the right to a fair solution if their complaints are valid.
